Sopot is without doubt the most celebrated coastal resort in Poland, but its fame did not come by chance. The city has made its way to the top through persistent effort to complement a hundred years of tradition with investment in modern infrastructure.

In the 19th century Sopot was a popular spa, famous for its healing baths and mineral waters. As time went by, Sopot's offer was enhanced with massage, 20th century city whose life started in the Art Deco period of the 1920's and 1930's. Gdynia saw a rapid growth during the post–war era and acquired a post– modern character due to extensive redevelopment in post–communist Poland. Gdynia is a dynamic, vibrant city, focused on attracting business, sports events and tourism. The city is well–known for its design and creative industries and for hosting a number of themed events, such as Gdynia Design Days.

Gdynia is often referred to as "a city made of the sea and dreams", which is a tribute to its extraordinary origins. It came to life on the wave of Poland's euphoria about regaining independence in 1918 following two centuries of foreign rule. At a pace unprecedented for the pre-war era, in the span of just ten years, a modern port city sprung into existence on the sandy beaches of the Baltic Sea. A successful start was just the beginning. During the coming few years the city will undergo another far-reaching re-development, which can only be compared in scale and extent to the city's meteoric rise between the 1920's and 1930's. Another milestone will be marked when the vast industrial spaces occupied by harbour installations, shipyards, fishing industries and processing plants are reclaimed for

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dry baths and irradiation. In the 1920's Sopot gained the status of an international spa resort. For visitors from all over Europe who used to come to the Polish seaside, a stay in Sopot was considered not only beneficial to one's health, but also as an important social occasion.

Sopot calms, and stirs your senses

Sopot, currently inhabited by almost 40,000 people, is home to more than a dozen top class SPA centres. They offer an astounding variety of treatments and SPA products, from exotic massage to traditional treatment and practically everything in between. What all local Spa & Wellness clinics have in common is that they all draw on the riches of the Baltic Sea. Salts, amber and algae are essential ingredients of many unique treatments.

Sopot also has another, fun-loving side. Monte Cassino Street, popularly called "Monciak", is the local landmark and a symbol of the night life allures. Czekolada, Spatif, Soho, Atelier, Versalka – for club-goers in Sopot these are all familiar names. The city's appeal is a combination of fin-de-siècle architecture and top rated entertainment, giving Sopot a distinctive character of a fashionable, vibrant, all-season destination.

Gdynia is the youngest city in the metropolitan conglomerate called Tri–City. It may not have a thousand years' old history like its better–known neighbour, Gdansk, but it is proud to be a modern, urban re-development. These spaces are considered prime locations, situated in the very heart of the city, surrounded on three sides by the sea. Where heavy industry once existed, Gdynia will gain a new centre, with restaurants, hotels, services, offices, housing developments and welcoming public spaces consisting of wide boulevards along the piers, marinas and the Sailing Museum soon to be erected.

We definitely recommend visiting Sierra Golf Club, designed by the celebrated Scotsman Cameron Sinclair. It is situated some 15.5 miles from Tri–City's western border. Magnificent surroundings, excellent infrastructure and friendly, professional staff add up to the club's unique appeal.

Sierra Golf Club meets all world standards. It is a full sized, 18–hole master class golf course (par 72), equipped with a modern driving range (26 rainproof posts), putting, chipping and pitching green. Carts are equipped with 11" touchscreen and GPS terminals connected to the local Wi–Fi network. This allows golfers to directly follow the results, get some useful tips or just comfortably move around the course. The system also keeps you informed about possible weather changes and lets you order drinks from the bar.

The natural landscape was enhanced by the addition of numerous hillocks and ravines. The existing streams and water features were enlarged and the entire area was drained when an integrated computer controlled irrigation system was installed.

Currently, the club has more than 280 members and each year adds new, prestigious events to the





agenda. Luxurious guest apartments are also available, offering cosy and comfortable accommodation in perfectly harmony with the natural surroundings.

Postolowo is another location that should feature high on each discerning golfer's itinerary. This golf course is situated 17 miles south of Gdansk. It was designed by the very experienced and talented golf course architect Jeremy Turner of Sweden, whose portfolio contains almost 50 top class golf facilities.

Postolowo is an 18-hole master class course spreading over nearly 250 acres. The length of the professional course exceeds 7,500 yards. To add to the master par 72 course, a 6-hole par 20 course was created for beginners, offering perfect conditions for the growing number of newcomers attracted to golf in the Pomorskie region.

The welcoming Tokary Golf Club provides its guests with a driving range, putting green, chipping green and a 3,200 yards, 9-hole course. Covering an area of 111 acres and situated ca. 12 miles from the centre of Gdansk, this is a perfect addition to your itinerary.

Whatever you decide, the level of service and reasonable prices will both delight and surprise!








Major tourist attractions in Warmia and Masuria

The Old Town in Elblag is a popular meeting place for Elblag residents and is also the focus of many cultural events. There are many significant Elblag monuments which you can visit, for example St. Nicolas Cathedral in the Old Town is the most significant sacred building in the city. Inside you can discover sacred historic relics. Beside the Cathedral lies the historic Church Path, which is an enchanting passageway between tenement houses. At Stary Rynek you will find the Market Gate, which is one of the most distinctive and also recognizable monuments in the town. And next to the Gate stands the monument of the legendary celebrated baker, who saved the city from the invasion of the Teutonic Knights in the 16th century.

Bazantarnia Forest, full of wooded hills, beautiful valleys, and mysterious ravines, is a favourite recreational place for residents of Elblag.

You will not want to miss a pleasure cruise on the incomparable Elblag Canal. Thanks to the unique slipways and other equipment used to transport the



canoes, ships, and boats on grass, perversely working against a natural barrier in the form of a 100-metre difference in water levels between Lakes Druzno and Pniewo. There are five inclined planes located in Buczyniec, Katy, Olesnica, Jelenie, and Caluny over which boats are pulled by ropes. This old design is based solely on the strength of the

boats on land, travellers can overcome the hundredmetre difference in water levels between Elblag and Ostróda. This unique world-class attraction will re-open in 2015, following renovation.

Construction work on the canal was begun in 1844 by Dutch engineer Georg Jacob Steenke. Measuring 147 km in total length, the canal gained its Polish name from the longest stretch between Ostróda and Elblag (82 km). The famous stretch between Maldyty and Elblag utilises unique hydro– technical solutions. Steenke copied engineering technologies from other countries, notably the Morris Canal in the USA, which was the prototype of Elblag Canal. What is surprising is that in this day and age the machinery and the Masuria canal work tirelessly transporting



water, which can be seen in one of the engine rooms. The inclined planes range between 350 to 550 meters in length, and the cruise across the grass takes about 20 minutes.

Nearby Elblag you can play golf at Sand Valley Golf & Country Club.

Sand Valley is a club built for its members to enjoy. It was also built for their guests to remember and cherish. It's hoped that the members will, on a daily basis, embrace the challenge offered by this classic golf course that is exposed to the elements of wind, rain, and drought. Also that the guests will head home with memories of every single hole they have played.

Playing golf in Sand Valley is different to the experience offered by most modern golf courses. They believe that golf is best played, by friends playing against each other vs. playing for score, and that walking is an essential part of a great round of golf.

Sand Valley offers wide and rumpling fairways, and heavily contoured greens. This is how the course has been designed and built, and this is how it is maintained. Providing firm and fast conditions throughout the golf course makes for a rewarding experience for all levels of golfer.

Sand Valley looks different than most modern courses, as designers Lassi Pekka Tilander and Tony Ristola have created a course that in many ways resembles the grand golf courses built during the early 20th century.

The construction and on-site design work was led by Tony Ristola, whose incredible crafts-manship can be seen throughout the course. Lassi Pekka Tilander is responsible for the natural routing of the



course and, with that, the majority of the strategies for the golf holes. But most importantly, both golf course architects involved in the project have been working play difficult. under the premise that Sand Valley should embrace the design ideals of the early 20th century, when the great the challenge of planning their way around the majority of the most legendary golf courses were created.

The result is that playing golf in Sand Valley is very different to most modern golf courses. The fairways are very wide, there is very little water in play, there is no penalizing bunkers on the course, which is always maintained to be firm and fast. In fact, despite not being a seaside course, there are few courses that play more links-like than Sand Valley. Also, the course is not difficult per se, but was designed to test the players' judgment, decision- making, and shot-making skills.

Certainly, players who are unwilling to adjust their game to the prevailing conditions will make the course

Conversely, those who successfully take on course will be rewarded by good scores and a wonderful feeling of having overcome a true test of golf.

If you enjoy luxury then Sand Valley Villas are just the place for relaxation after a satisfying round. The stunning Villas and Clubhouse, only metres away from the 1st tee box, are styled in the Scandinavian traditions of simplicity and function. The Villas house 4 to 12 people and are equipped with saunas, while the larger houses come complete with a private swimming pool or jaccuzzi.

and soul here. Admiring nature, watching the Warmian sky, drinking exquisite wine, listening to concerts, debating, reading... Today, it's your turn! There are 122 rooms available.

There is also an observatory, housed in a clock tower and available to guests, which stands as a tribute to Nicolaus Copernicus, the eminent astronomer and creator of the heliocentric theory, who once resided in the castle. Meanwhile, the spa and wellness area in the basement allows you to indulge in relaxation rituals, regenerate, and find harmony of body and soul. Hotel Krasicki is the art of life and the art of hospitality.

Ostróda which is surrounded by nine lakes, is a dynamic town. In summer there are numerous events and parties, including extremely popular concerts on the pier on Lake Drweckie, close to the town centre. You will be sure to receive a warm welcome at the many cosy cafes and restaurants in the vicinity of the promenade, not to mention the luxurious SPA & Wellness Willa Port ***** Hotel (www.willaport.pl), which offers fabulous views of the water skiing on the lake.

Olsztyn is the largest city in the region and the capital of Warmia and Masuria. More than 170,000 people live in this city, which has over 650 years of history. The most famous monuments in Olsztyn are the gothic castle, the Cathedral of Saint Jacob, and the Upper Gate, which is located on the border of the old city walls.

The greatest advantage of the city is its unique location among forest and lakes. There are twelve lakes - some people even claim fifteen! - and the City Forest, which is one of the biggest European parks - all lying within the borders of Olsztyn. To accent these advantages, Olsztyn has been carefully developed to fit the concept of a city garden. The defensive architecture of 14th century Warmia and combined with architecture from the 19th and 20th century secession, along with the interesting performances, concerts, and exhibitions, offers the discerning tourist the opportunity to find in Olsztyn the possibility of tranquility and an escape from the noise and bustle of their usual daily routine. Strolling through the streets of the Old City they might admire the city walls and the massive construction of the castle. Face-to-face with the original astronomical plaque, which is totally unique due to being handmade by Nicolaus Copernicus himself, they can hear the echo of history and later discover the most up to date astronomical equipment at Olsztyn's planetarium.

Nicolaus Copernicus is the most famous person in the history of Olsztyn. While he was a resident in Olsztyn, he managed goods and defended the city from Teutonic forces. Here he carried out his great research and wrote magnificent works. And today four of Olsztyn's colleges maintain this tradition of excellence in Science; over 30,000 people study at the largest of them, the University of Warmia and Masuria. Olsztyn is well worth a visit. It is - genuinely - a natural garden city!

Nearby Olsztyn there happens to be another great
